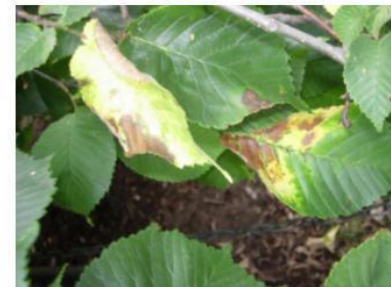
There is nothing quite like a good condition, well maintained lawn to set off your garden. It's the finishing touch, just like a frame around a painting.

Even poor quality soil can be improved to the extent that you can have a lush garden.

MOVING PLANTS

While winter is the ideal time to move plants they can be successfully moved at any time throughout the year provided care is taken.

Smaller plants, under three feet high, are the easiest to move. The first step is to trim the plant by about one third.

The next step is to dig the plant out ensuring that the root ball is approximately the same diameter as the plant.

MOSS

If you have moss on your lawn then this can be a sign of two main problems. Either you have a drainage problem or poor nutrition.

With moss on your lawn you will need to remove as much of the moss as possible before you start to take action to prevent it from coming back again.

Aerating the lawn will help to solve the problem. There are various ways that this can be done.

The best way to aerate your lawn is with a coring machine that actually pulls small plugs of approximately 2 inches from the lawn.

MULCH

What is a weed? A weed is a plant whose virtues have not yet been discovered.

Soil is a main food supply for your plants but sometimes plants need a little more help and that can be in the form of fertilizer or mulch.

Mulch is great for plants, simply because you are turning something that would normally be thrown out as waste into a food supply and a very effective one at that.

Mulch will help to maintain moisture in the soil and reduce the weeds in the garden too.

NUTRIENT DEFICIENCY

There are many different symptoms that can show where there has been a nutrient deficiency in a plant.

Because all plants respond differently to a lack of nutrients it is not always easy to determine whether it is a deficiency or something else that is causing the changes to the plant.

PAVING AND WALKWAYS

Laying good paving and walkways around your garden can add considerably to the number of months during the year when you will be able to enjoy your garden and whether or not you will be able to work in it.

During the wet season, unless you have suitable areas to walk without the ground turning to mush and mud, you won't be able to access your garden to do the necessary maintenance.

Paving can also add to the style of your garden by adding a border that will set off the plants.

It also allows you to add drainage and redirect water that could end up flowing into the garden and causing damage to the plants by letting them get waterlogged.



PLANTING BY THE MOON

As plants are approximately 90% water, it is believed by many gardeners that all planting should be done according to the phases of the moon.

The moon affects the movement of water on the earth and this is their reason for believing that the moon also has an effect on the growth patterns of plants.

Some people also believe that by planting according to the lunar cycles you will get tastier fruits from your plants and bigger, more vibrant colors from their flowers.

While many people don't follow this idea of planting according to the moon, it is surprising to see that there are a lot of people who will still follow the suggestions of recommended planting times even though they are skeptical.

PRUNING

Most plants will remain healthier and stronger if they are pruned occasionally.

Trees will bear more fruit if they are pruned and plants such as roses will have more blossoms and not become 'woody' if they are pruned correctly.

Bushes and hedges can also benefit from pruning as this can reduce or eliminate the possibility of diseases and problems with pests.

By removing the old growth you will allow new growth to flourish as new shoots are allowed to come through.

For many people pruning is a hobby or an art form where they can create interesting shapes with their plants. This is made easier when done on plants that have smaller more tightly bunched leaves.

One of the best soil conditioners you can get for your garden is seaweed.

If you don't live near a beach then you can still get the benefits of seaweed in your garden by buying dried seaweed in very affordable packs from garden centers.

TESTING THE PH OF YOUR SOIL

It is easy to test the pH of the soil in your garden with the use of a simple and inexpensive test kit.

All you need to do with the test kit is take a sample of the soil and mix it with water and then compare the results in the sample to the colors on the chart. This will tell you whether the soil is acidic or alkaline.

If the soil is too acidic you can add lime to bring it back into balance.

SUCCULENTS

To ensure that your succulents get the very best in growing conditions, particularly if you are growing them in pots, you will need to buy good quality specially formulated succulent mix.

This is generally the same type mix that you would also use for growing cacti.

Slow release fertilizer will help them to remain healthier by supplying them with necessary nutrients throughout the year and the best time to give them this fertilizer is in spring.

This will cause the leaves to go a yellow or brown color and they will usually drop off. When plants start getting waterlogged the leaves at the bottom of the plant will be affected first.

Plants are approximately 90% water and therefore it is essential that they get enough water to survive.

Gardening is all about balance and that applies to the amount of water your plants need to stay healthy.

Over watering can be as harmful as not giving them enough water.

The soil that the plants are growing in is a big factor in the amount of water that you should be giving them.

If the soil is heavy and doesn't drain well you will need to give them less water or they could get water logged and the roots can rot.

If the soil is a lot freer draining then you might need to water a little more often.

If by chance you are using a weed killer and it accidentally gets on to your plants you should hose it off immediately. The sooner you can do this the less chance of damage affecting the condition of your plant.

Sometimes while we are spraying elsewhere a wind can carry the spray to other plants and it won't be until sometime later that the damage from this appears.

This damage will appear as leaves that have become smaller, narrowed and twisted.
